#### What does Ofsted tell us?

 "Fixed term exclusions too high, indicating a possible concern with behaviours and focus in some lessons".

Fixed term exclusions now below National.

#### What does Ofsted tell us?

We require improvement in certain areas:

"Judgements about the school performance too generous.

Quality of judgements have been affirmed by Governors and LA.

Longhill judgements the most accurate in the City, at a period of great uncertainty and volatility.

Governors have been quality assured through the NLG programme.

#### What does Ofsted tell us?

We require improvement in certain areas:

"Student progress, particularly students who are the focus for Pupil Premium Grant".

- Ten subjects are above National attainment, the majority close.
- We have closed the gap in achievement, but needs to close further.
- We have focus still in English and Maths, areas for improvement.
- Lower ability Maths, Upper ability English, Pupil premium progress.

#### 1.Achievement

To raise the achievement of all students to that of National levels and close any progress gaps through.

- Pupil Premium students making at least the same progress as other students. This should specifically be demonstrated through English and Maths.
- Upper Ability progress rates in Maths and English should be at National levels with additional focus on lower ability Maths progress.
- The number of students gaining their Minimum Grade (MG)
  needs to increase to enable the APS and the Value Added scores
  across the school to be at National levels.

#### 2. Teaching & Learning

The quality of Teaching & Learning is developed to enable the gap in progress to be closed through:

- Effective diagnosis of need through high quality assessment.
- Effective intervention taking place for those students who are not making expected levels of progress.
- Quality evaluation of strategies, leading to better and improved intervention to close the progress gaps that exist.

#### 3. Behaviour & Safety

To demonstrate the effective engagement of all students, create an ethos that enables effective learning and results in the reduction of any progress gaps.

- Maintain fixed term exclusions to be below that of National figures.
- To reduce the gap between Pupil Premium students and others to below that of National in terms of: Attendance, PA and FTE.
- To raise levels of aspiration and motivation of Pupil Premium students to that of non- Pupil Premium students

#### 4. Leadership & Management

To ensure the School Leaders are effective in their role and move the school back to 'Good' through Ofsted judgement:

- Maintain NLG support, to develop the role of Governors.
- Leadership and management of the school is enhanced through effective and challenging partnership.
- Develop clearer accountability measures at all levels, to enable progress strategies to be well directed, managed and any progress gaps reduced to national.



# A Brief Introduction to the SEND Code of Practice, 2014

What you need to know now

## Why Change?

- SEND education has changed society for the better since Warnock (1978) but there are things that need to be done now to move forward
- Previous SEN Code of Practice- last revised 2001; inclusive practice has moved on
- It has been suggested that under current system:-
- a) Family voice lost
- b) No extension beyond 16
- c) Wider agencies not fully involved at a statutory level

#### The information in brief...





- Brighton & Hove will be launching a city-wide approach soon.
- This will be a transition year as systems switch for students at SA & SA+.
   The current SA & SA+ categories will be redesignated by April 2015
- Statements will be changed between now and 2018 into EHCP's (Education, Health & Care Plans)

#### Main Expected national Changes...

- Aspirations need to continue to rise to close attainment gaps-Nationally, SEND currently over represented in NEET figures
- Brighton & Hove are publishing a strategy early this academic year
- Longhill will be compliant and will ensure additional general information is communicated to parents and carers on the website
- All families with a child currently on the SEND register will be sent personalised information, once B&H have communicated the changes to us
- There are no plans to change any support at this time.





#### The Information Portal

Communication between home and school is essential. We have tried to make the routes of communication as easy as possible and to make sure you have up-to-date information at your fingertips.

The Information Portal is accessed from the schools website and is designed for both parent and student use. It contains the most up-to-date information on your child's attendance, behaviour and progress. All our homework is set via the portal so you can monitor that it is being completed and all of our reports are published on the portal. You can also contact your child's teacher, mentor or head of house directly from the portal.

The system can be accessed from the front page of our website <a href="www.longhill.org.uk">www.longhill.org.uk</a> using the "Information Portal" link on the right hand side of the home page, or from the Learning Menu at the top of the screen.





The first time you log on to the Information Portal, you need to request the system send you a password.

On the Information Portal login page, find the "Forgotten your password" box:

Enter in to the box the email address you gave to the school to contact you with. Click "Submit".

You should shortly receive a password for the Information Portal in your email. Your username will always be your email address.
