#### Well-being & Self Harm

There will be two days taking Year 8 off timetable on 22nd and 23rd June. We are proposing to run four workshops which Year 8 students will rotate around: 1) Self Harm

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- 2) Reducing stress and anxiety
- 3) Counselling and signposting of support
- 4) Healthy Eating

Two of the workshops will be taken by external speakers who are specialised in the areas of self-harm and reducing stress.

Ms Siobhan McCurdy and our School Counsellor will take a third workshop and then one of the PSHE team will take the fourth workshop.

The afternoon will consist of a relevant showing of a film / clip to reinforce the importance of some/all of these topics.

Kerry and her team have also offered to attend the Yr 8 Parents evening during the week before to run a series of workshops for parents on the issue of self harm which is a concern at the moment... We will invite parents to book into these workshops.

At the Woodingdean Youth Centre training day, we took part in various activities in which we had to act in real life situations to give us the feel of what we would have to do next year with our year 6 mentees to help them through their transition to Longhill.

During our weekly training sessions we would talk about various issues which could possibly affect our mentees and how to resolve them. Upon talking to two other trainees, they both said they thoroughly enjoyed it, one even said "It was fantastically fun!" The other said "I enjoyed it lots and I learnt a lot"

Longhill's Peer mentors are ready to start work with their year sixes from our main feeder schools and the scheme is bigger than ever with the primary schools wanting more help for more students than ever before.


#### **Beauty and the Beast**
