You do not need any specific skils or experience to become a governor, but be willing to commit your time to the welfare of our students. Training will be provided.

There are four full governing board meetings each academic year, which all governors are expected to attend. In addition, you would be a member of a subcommittee which meets four times a year. Meetings usually begin at 4pm and end at 6pm.

Governors also spend time reading papers and preparing questions before the meetings, as well as carrying out liaison with various parts of the school, attending training and being members of working groups or panels as required.
